

Additional Scholarship Resources

AAIA Adolph Van Pelt Scholarship

AAIA is grateful for the vision and generosity of Mrs. Van Pelt and the Adolph Van Pelt Foundation in planning for the higher education of Native students. Without those like Mrs. Van Pelt and the Foundation, AAIA would not be able to provide as many scholarships to Native students seeking a higher education. This scholarship is for undergraduate students from federally recognized tribes.

AAIA Sequoyah Graduate Scholarship

The Association on American Indian Affairs offers Sequoyah Graduate Scholarships to students in any curriculum. This scholarship does not automatically renew. Students are eligible to apply on a yearly basis.

ACS Scholars Program

ACS awards renewable scholarships to underrepresented minority students who want to enter the fields of chemistry or chemistry-related fields. American Indian high school seniors or college freshman, sophomores, or juniors pursuing a college degree in the chemical sciences or chemical technology are eligible to apply. Deadline: March 1st.

The Actuarial Diversity Scholarship

The Actuarial Foundation supports the future of the actuarial profession and fosters the best and brightest students through its scholarships. Deadline: May 2nd

AIANTA Scholarship: Undergraduate and Graduate (Descendants Eligible)

AIANTA will award three (3) individuals who have met all scholarship application criteria. AIANTA would like to encourage Indigenous students to build their careers in the tourism industry while sustaining and strengthening their cultural legacy. Deadline: July 28th.

AICPA Fellowship for Minority Doctoral Students

The program's goal is to increase the number of minority CPAs who serve as role models and mentors to young people in the academic environment and university classrooms. Deadline: May 15th

Albert W. Dent Graduate Student Scholarship

Offered annually, the Albert W. Dent Graduate Student Scholarship is designated for minority students enrolled in their final year of a healthcare management graduate program. Deadline: March 31st

American Bus Association (ABA) Diversity Scholarship

The Diversity Scholarship focuses on broadening the number of traditionally underrepresented groups in the management and operation ranks of the transportation, travel, and tourism industry. Deadline: April

American Indian College Fund (AICF) (Descendants Eligible)

The American Indian College Fund was established in 1989 to provide scholarships to American Indian/Alaska Native students attending tribal colleges, and to fund and create awareness about the community-based accredited tribal colleges and universities that offer students access to knowledge and skills alongside Native culture, language, and values. AICF offers the Full Circle and TCU scholarships.

American Indian Education Foundation (AIEF)

The American Indian Education Foundation was established to support educational opportunities for American Indian and Alaska Native students. Our vision is strong, self-sufficient American Indian communities. Scholarships are awarded for each school year and are chosen by a national selection committee. Deadline: April 4th

American Indian Graduate Center (AIGC)

The American Indian Graduate Center provides fellowships to American Indian and Alaska Native graduate students throughout the United States. They also offer undergraduate opportunities for Native scholars. Deadline: Varies

American Indian Nurse Scholarship Awards

The American Indian Nurse Scholarship Award Program was started by the NSCDA in 1927 to give students of American Indian descent the opportunity to pursue careers in nursing. The National Society of The Colonial Dames of America has provided a small number of scholarship awards to assist students of American Indian heritage who are pursuing degrees in nursing or in the field of health care and health education. Eligible students receive per semester and the money is to be used strictly for tuition, books or fees applicable to the student's approved program. The grant is sent to the school and credited to the student's account. Once a student is accepted, he or she may reapply for continued funds each semester as long as the student remains in academic good standing. Deadline: June 1st, 2017

American Indian Science and Engineering Society (AISES)

The mission of the American Indian Science and Engineering Society (AISES) is to substantially increase the representation of American Indians and Alaskan Natives in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) studies and careers. They offer a variety of STEM-related scholarships and professional development opportunities. Deadline: Varies

American Indian Services Scholarships (Descendants Eligible)

The mission of the American Indian Services is to assist Native Americans in developing their human and natural resources in order to help them make a contribution to society without detracting from the

culture and background from which they have emerge through a variety of scholarship opportunities. Deadline: Varies

American Institute of CPAs

AICPA offers many scholarship opportunities for accounting students from minority groups at varying points in their academic careers. Deadline: Varies

American Meteorological Society (AMS) Minority Scholarships

The American Meteorological Society (AMS) administers an array of graduate fellowships and undergraduate scholarships to help further the education students pursuing a career in the atmospheric and related oceanic or hydrologic sciences. Deadline: Varies

American Planning Association Scholarships

Women and minority (African American, Hispanic American, or Native American) students enrolled in an approved Planning Accreditation Board (PAB) planning program who are citizens of the United States, intend to pursue careers as practicing planners in the public sector, and are able to demonstrate a genuine financial need are eligible to apply for this scholarship which will range between \$2,000 to \$4,000. Deadline: April 30th

Annual Minority Scholarship

Scholarship is open to minority students who are currently attending an accredited technical school, community college, college, or university and have completed at least one semester in good standing. Applicant must submit an essay on a given topic related to cultural diversity. Deadline: June 30th, 2017

Association on American Indian Affairs

AAIA provides scholarships to graduate (including PhD, Medicine and Law) and undergraduate students from federally recognized tribes and tribes that are not recognized by the federal government. Deadline: June 1st

AWWA Holly A. Cornell Scholarship

Sponsored by CH2M, this scholarship encourages and supports outstanding female and/or minority masters' students in pursuit of advanced training in the field of water supply and treatment. Deadline: January 11th

Box Engineering Diversity Scholarship

This scholarship aims to support minority STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) students who are applying technology to their fields. Deadline: October 23rd

Brown and Caldwell Minority Scholarship

This is a \$5,000 Minority Scholarship Program to help minority groups succeed in the environmental engineering industry. Deadline: April 15th

CANFIT Scholarships

Undergraduate and graduate scholarships are available for California African-American, American Indian, Alaska Native, Asian American, Pacific Islander or Latino/Hispanic students expressing financial need to study nutrition, physical education or culinary arts in the state of California. Deadline: March 31st

Catching the Dream

Catching the Dream, formerly known as the Native American Scholarship Fund, makes grants to Native college students and works to improve Indian schools through a variety of scholarship programs. Deadline: Varies

Cobell Scholarship

Scholarships in various amounts are awarded to U.S. Federally-recognized American Indian and Alaska Native community members (students) who are vocational certificate-seeking or associate, bachelor, graduate and professional degree-seeking students in full-time, accredited, non-profit institutions in the United States; and who are able to demonstrate financial need through the submission of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Deadline: January 1st, June 30th

Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars

This scholarship requires students to be an enrolled tribal member and plan to work with a tribe or nation in the field of Education or Social Service. Deadline: June 15th

Daughters of the Revolution, American Indian Scholarships

This scholarship is awarded to help Native Americans students of any age, any tribe and in any state striving to get an education at the undergraduate or graduate levels. However, undergraduate students are given preference. All awards are judged based on financial need and academic achievement.

Deadline: February 15th

Elliott C. Roberts Scholarship

The Elliott C. Roberts Scholarship is available to first and second year graduate students who are pursuing degrees in healthcare administration or comparable degree program (i.e., MBA, MPH, MHA, MPA, MSN or BSN). Deadline: TBA

Ellis Injury Law Diversity Scholarship

The Ellis Injury Law Diversity Scholarship Award is for \$3,000 available to both undergraduate and law school students who are either members of an ethnic/racial minority or have shown a strong commitment to diversity issues throughout their education. Deadline: June 30th

Entertainment Software Association (ESA) Foundation Scholarship

In 2007 the ESA Foundation established a scholarship program to assist women and minority students who are pursuing degrees leading to careers in Computer & Video Game Arts. Deadline: April 1st

EPP/MSI Undergraduate Scholarship Program

The EPP/MSI Undergraduate Scholarship Program provides scholarships for two years of undergraduate study to rising junior undergraduate students majoring in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) fields that directly support NOAA's mission. Participants conduct research at a NOAA facility during two paid summer internships. Deadline: January

ESA Foundation Scholarship Program

The ESA Foundation scholarships are offered for full-time undergraduate study at accredited four-year colleges and universities in the USA. Up to 30 scholarships of \$3,000 each will be awarded annually, 15 to graduating high school seniors and 15 to current college students. Women and minority students are eligible to apply, so long as they are U.S. citizens and have a minimum 2.75 GPA. Students must also be pursuing degrees leading to careers in computer and video game arts. Deadline: April 27th, 2018

Fontana Transport Inc. Scholars Program

This scholarship seeks low income, underrepresented, and first generation college prospects who are passionate about furthering their education as a means to help out their family, community and themselves. Deadline: March 15th

The Gates Millennium Scholars Program

The Gates Millennium Scholars is a scholarship program is funded by a \$1.6 billion grant by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. For Native American students, this program is administered through the American Indian Graduate Center. Deadline: January 13th

GRCF Arts Council of Greater Grand Rapids Minority Scholarship

The Arts Council of Greater Grand Rapids Minority Scholarship is open to students of color (African-American, Asian, Hispanic, Native American, Pacific Islander) attending a non-profit public or private college/university majoring in fine arts, including all visual and performing arts. Applicants must have financial need, be a Kent County resident, and have a minimum 2.5 GPA.

GRCF Jackie Klinesteker Minority Scholarship

The Jackie Klinesteker Minority Scholarship is awarded to students of color (African-American, Asian, Hispanic, Native American, Pacific Islander) residing in West Michigan with a declared major in a mental health-related field of student at an accredited college/university located in Michigan. Graduate level students will be given first preference. Must have financial need and a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average.

The Indian Health Services (IHS) Scholarships

The Indian Health Service (IHS) offers three scholarships for American Indian and Alaska Native students in order to train health professionals to staff Indian health programs. Deadline: March 28th

International Order of the King's Daughters and Sons: North American Indian Scholarships

The IOKDS offers \$500 to \$700 scholarships to North American Indians. There is no restriction as to tribal affiliation or Indian blood quantity. However, the student must provide a tribal registration number and fulfill other requirements. The scholarships are given for technical, vocational or college studies, but not granted for schooling beyond a bachelor's degree. Deadline: April 1st

Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship

Scholarship is open to graduating, minority high school seniors who plan on attending an accredited and approved four-year institution within the United States. Applicant must show leadership potential, dedication to community service, and evidence of financial need. Deadline: February 1^{5th}, 2018

J. Paris Mosley Scholarship

This scholarship aims to provide annual scholarships to persons who are deaf or hard of hearing or whose primary caregivers are deaf or hard of hearing to attain their post-secondary education; preference for Native American applicants. Deadline: March 15th

Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Scholarships

The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation's scholarship programs are designed to encourage and support outstanding students who work hard and have financial need. They also offer scholarships for students transferring from a 2-year to a 4-year program. Deadline: Varies

LAGRANT Foundation

The LAGRANT Foundation (TLF) provides 15 scholarships annually to ethnically diverse minority undergraduate and graduate students who are attending accredited institutions and are pursuing careers in the fields of advertising, marketing or public relations. Deadline: February 28th

LITA/LSSI Minority Scholarship

The scholarship is designed to encourage the entry of qualified persons into the library and automation field who plan to follow a career in that field; who demonstrate potential in, and a strong commitment to the use of automated systems in libraries; and who are qualified members of a principal minority group. Deadline: March 1st

Marcia Silverman Minority Student Award

Scholarship is open to students entering their senior year of undergraduate studies who are enrolled in a journalism or public relations program and preparing for a career in public relations. Applicant must

also be of African-American/Black, Hispanic/Latino, Asian, Native American, Alaskan Native or Pacific Islander ancestry.

The Maureen L. and Howard N. Blitman, P.E., Scholarship to Promote Diversity in Engineering

This scholarship is awarded annually to a high school senior from an ethnic minority who has been accepted into an ABET-accredited engineering program at a four-year college or university. Deadline: March 1st

Michigan Indian Elders Association Scholarship (Descendants Eligible)

The Michigan Indian Elders Association (MIEA) provides (4) \$1000 scholarships and (6) \$500 scholarships to undergraduate and graduate students. Each student must be currently enrolled in a course of study at, or have a letter of acceptance from, a public college or university or technical school and must meet additional qualifications. Deadline: June 15th

Minnesota Indian Scholarship Program

The Minnesota Indian Scholarship Program provides post-secondary financial assistance to eligible Minnesota resident students who are of one-fourth or more Indian ancestry and demonstrate financial need for an award. Deadline: July 1st

Nathan L. Anderson Foundation Scholarship

Scholarship is open to minority students who are pursuing undergraduate training in Computer Science, Aviation, Nursing, or Music. Deadline: August 31st, 2017

Native Vision Johns Hopkins School of Public Health Scholarship: Undergraduate

Established in 1996, Native Vision gives annually a \$5,000 college scholarship to outstanding American Indian young people with a commitment to education, athletics and leadership. Deadline: May 12th.

National Action Council for Minorities in Engineering (NACME)

NACME is responsible for more than \$4 million in scholarships awarded annually to underrepresented minority (URM) students and expects to support approximately 1,300 underrepresented minority engineering students in 2016. Deadline: Varies

National Center for American Indian Enterprise Development

This scholarship program is for full-time junior, senior, or graduate-level business students. Deadline: TBA

Native Agriculture and Food Systems (NAFSI) Scholarship Program

First Nations will award six \$1,000 scholarships annually to Native American college students majoring in agriculture and agriculture-related fields, including but not limited to: agribusiness management,

agriscience technologies, agronomy, animal husbandry, aquaponics, fisheries and wildlife, food production and safety, food-related policy and legislation, horticulture, irrigation science, plant-based nutrition, and sustainable agriculture or food systems. Deadline: TBA

National Medical Fellowships: Scholarships

National Medical Fellowships offers a number of scholarship programs that are awarded on the basis of need and merit to Native American and other underrepresented minority students. Deadline: TBA

National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA)

This organization provides financial assistance, through competitive processes, to students and Minority Serving Institutions that support the training of students and research in NOAA mission sciences. Deadline: Varies

Native American Journalists Association (NAJA)

Each year, NAJA offers scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$2,500 to Native American students pursuing journalism degrees at a higher learning institution. Deadline: TBA

NSCDA American Indian Nurse Scholarship Awards (Descendants Eligible)

The American Indian Nurse Scholarship Award Program was started by the NSCDA in 1927 to give students of American Indian descent the opportunity to pursue careers in nursing. Deadline: June 1st, December 1st

Scholarship is open to tribally enrolled Native American Indians attending colleges, universities, and accredited post-secondary educational institutions on a full-time basis. Deadline: June 1st, 2017

Petoskey Harbor Springs Foundation:

The Community Foundation is pleased to offer up to 35 scholarships totaling \$42,000 to eligible Emmet County students for 2017. Deadline: March 17th.

Phyllis G. Meekins Scholarship

The Phyllis G. Meekins Scholarship is a need-based award granted to a high school senior from a recognized minority background who will be playing golf at the collegiate level. Qualifications for all scholarships include strong academic programs, community service and recommendations. Deadline: TBA

Society of American Indian Government Employees (SAIGE) Member Scholarships

SAIGE offers a number of different scholarships for American Indian or Alaska Native government employees and students for professional development, annual training, or continuing education. Deadline: September 30th

Society for American Archaeology Native American Scholarships

The Native American Scholarships Fund is an endowment established to foster a sense of shared purpose and positive interaction between archaeologists and Native Americans. Scholarships are open to all Native peoples from anywhere in the Americas, Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians, and Indigenous Pacific Islanders. Deadline: December 15th

Truman D. Picard Scholarship – Intertribal Timber Council

The Truman D. Picard Scholarship Program is dedicated to the support of Native American students pursuing a higher education in Natural Resources. Deadline: January 11th

The Udall Foundation

This foundation awards scholarships to sophomore and junior level college students committed to careers related to the environment, tribal public policy, or Native American health care. Deadline: March 2nd

Washington Indian Gaming Association

The WIGA College Scholarship Program is designed to promote tribal self-sufficiency by providing scholarships for Native American students in Washington seeking to advance their own self-sufficiency and broaden their personal and professional potential through higher education. Applicants must be students who are enrolled members of one of Washington's 29 federally recognized tribes or who are enrolled members of federally recognized tribes outside of Washington, but are attending school in Washington State. Deadline: March 31st

Wells Fargo Scholarship for Undergraduates (Descendants Eligible)

This scholarship is funded by Wells Fargo and administered by American Indian Graduate Center. To be considered an applicant must be enrolled in a federally recognized tribe and be a junior or senior

pursuing a career and degree in fields related to banking, resort management, gaming operations, management and administration, including accounting, finance, information technology and human resources. Deadline: May 1st

Xerox Minority Scholarships
