- WHEREAS** the Waganakising Odawa Nation, known as the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, and its citizens are vested with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians (“LTBB” or “Tribe”) is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);
- WHEREAS** the Tribe operates programs and provides services that benefit the Tribal citizens and the Tribal community;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Education Department is dedicated to the vision of a community of healthy and flourishing families who are able to walk successfully in two worlds and living “mnobimaadziwin” – the good life;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Education Department is committed to its mission to promote the healing, sovereignty and well-being of the LTBB Odawa by providing comprehensive, exceptional, formal and informal learning opportunities for tribal and non-tribal youth, adults and elders that empower our families, preserve the knowledge of our elders and prepare and position all learners we encounter to create a more just and equitable world for all people;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Education Department is organized into four major areas, one of which is the Waganakising Odawa Career and Technical Educational Program (WOCTEP) that has been in operation for over seven years and is a crucial component of the Education Department;






