

ORDER FOR DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

On November 8, 2012 this Court held a hearing for a petition to dissolve the marriage of Jaimée Lynn Hankins and Keith Allen Hankins.

There are no children that are a product of this marriage negating the need for any custody determinations. Additionally, Jaimée Lynn Hankins swore that she is not currently pregnant.

Neither party requested alimony.

Finally neither party requested that the Court decide any real or tangible property matters related to the marriage.

LTBB Tribal law allows for the dissolution of marriage in two circumstances. A decree of dissolution of marriage shall be granted without regard to the fault of the parties if the Court finds the marriage has broken down irretrievably and there remains no reasonable likelihood that the marriage can be preserved, or if the parties have mutually and voluntarily lived separate and apart without cohabitation for at least one year immediately prior to the filing of the petition for divorce. WOTC 13.205 (1). As the parties still live together due to financial circumstances beyond their control, the Court took testimony regarding the status of the marriage.

Based on the testimony made on the record Tribal Court makes the following findings by a preponderance of the evidence:

1. The marriage has broken down irretrievably; and
