**RESOLUTION 02189602
COUNCIL ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

WHEREAS, although the Federally recognized tribes in Michigan are separate sovereigns, they share the common goals of the preservation of their cultures and traditions, and the promotion of the welfare of their members through health care and educational and economic opportunity;

WHEREAS, the Tribes, through concerted action, may increase their chances of success to achieve these common goals;

WHEREAS, the Tribes are forming a Council on Economic Development to foster concerted political and legal efforts to achieve greater educational and economic opportunity for their members;

THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians joins the Council on Economic Development for the purpose of working together with other Tribes in Michigan to promote the welfare of their memberships.
