SUPPORT FOR GRANT APPLICATION
TO THE PETOSKEY-HARBOR SPRINGS AREA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians (LTBB) is a federally recognized Indian tribe as reaffirmed under Public Law 103-324, as amended, 25 U.S.C. §1300k, and as such is treated by Federal law as a 501(C)(3) organization for purposes of receiving grants and tax deductible contributions;

WHEREAS to preserve its history and to educate the general public LTBB operates the Andrew J. Blackbird Museum pursuant to a lease agreement with the City of Harbor Springs. The Museum is managed by LTBB as a cultural preservation project, and LTBB appoints a committee consisting of members and non-members of LTBB to oversee the Museum operations;

WHEREAS LTBB believes that a need exists to provide the public with a marker that will identify the historical and cultural context of the Andrew J. Blackbird home, which is now the Museum located at 368 Main Street in Harbor Springs;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians supports a grant application to the Petoskey-Harbor Springs Area Community Foundation for \$2,374.00 to enable it to purchase and erect such marker.
