WHEREAS the Waganakising Odawak, known in English as Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a nation of citizens with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance and;

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians ("LTBB") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621); and

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected legislative body of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS the Tribe recognizes the impact of alcohol and substance abuse within the LTBB community; and

WHEREAS the Tribe operates a Substance Abuse/Mental Health Services program that is staffed by a culturally sensitive team of qualified professionals that assist Tribal members in fostering healthy lifestyles and healthy decision making; and

WHEREAS the Tribe recognizes that research has shown that to effectively change attitudes, perception and ultimately behavior, prevention strategies must include a comprehensive approach that addresses both the individual and the environment; and

WHEREAS LTBB is eligible to apply for funding from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to prevent the onset and reduce the progression of underage drinking and marijuana use by building upon the established LTBB prevention infrastructure.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians authorizes and supports this grant application to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, Center for Substance Abuse Prevention Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, Strategic Prevention Framework Partnerships for Success State and Tribal Initiative Grant SPRING Project.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the LTBB Tribal Chair, Vice Chair, Tribal Administrator, or another designee from the Tribal Chair is authorized to execute any documents necessary to apply for, receive, and administer funds under the grant.
