Request for Funding from Futures Without Violence
Project Connect 2.0: A Coordinated Public Health Initiative to Prevent and
Respond to Violence Against Women
Year 03 Funding Increase

- WHEREAS** the Waganakising Odawak Nation, known as the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, and its citizens are vested with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected legislative body of the Tribe;
- WHEREAS** the Tribe has a very high regard for the health and well-being of Tribal citizens and their families and addresses this priority by providing health care services within a Tribal health care system;
- WHEREAS** the Tribe recognizes that domestic and sexual violence pose a significant health threat to Native women;
- WHEREAS** the Tribe's health care setting offers a critical opportunity for early identification and primary prevention of abuse;
- WHEREAS** the Tribe seeks to improve health and safety of women and children by improving the public health response to domestic and sexual violence;
- WHEREAS** the Tribe is a 36-month sub contract recipient of U.S. Department of Health & Human Services funding for the Project Connect 2.0: A Coordinated Public Health Initiative to Prevent and Respond to Violence Against Women via Futures Without Violence.
- WHEREAS** the Tribe is receiving a funding increase from \$50,000 to \$62,750 for Year 03 program implementation.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians accepts the \$12,750 funding increase from Futures Without Violence for Year 03 program implementation.


BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians will continue to provide the required 25% matching contribution through in-kind contributions from staff time.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the LTBB Tribal Chair, Vice Chair, Tribal Administrator, or another designee from the Tribal Chair is authorized to execute any documents necessary to apply for, receive, and administer funds under the grant.


