Request for Funding from the Consumers Energy Foundation
LTBB Community Museum and Archives' Displays

- WHEREAS** the Waganakising Odawak, known in English as Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a nation of citizens with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance and; and
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians ("LTBB") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621); and
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected legislative body of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS** the Tribe relies on the collection of tribal history and culture that is significant to the identity of the Odawa people including Odawa history, spirituality, traditions, arts, values and mannerisms; and
- WHEREAS** the Tribe operates a Repatriation, Archives and Records department with a goal to provide meaningful and accurate information regarding the history of the Odawa/Anishinaabek and repatriation issues to the widest range of audiences possible; and
- WHEREAS** the Tribe has identified the need for a Tribal museum and archival storage community facility that will display and protect an invaluable collection of LTBB items and archives; and
- WHEREAS** the Tribal museum and archives community facility will serve for the betterment of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians as well as the surrounding communities by addressing needs identified in the Waganakising Odawak Statute 2012-002; and
- WHEREAS** the Consumers Energy Foundation has announced funding to create sustainable communities by awarding grants in five focus areas including culture and the arts to support efforts that increase awareness of culture and the arts and encourage their growth particularly for regions or populations that would otherwise be unable to participate.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians authorizes and supports this grant application to the Consumers Energy Foundation to ensure the preservation of LTBB archival items via the development of displays for the Community Museum and Archives building.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the LTBB Tribal Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Tribal Administrator, or another designee from the Tribal Chairperson is authorized to execute any documents necessary to apply for, receive, and administer funds under the grant.
