Request for Funding from the United States Department of Justice,
FY 2016 Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation (CTAS)

- WHEREAS** the Waganakising Odawak, known in English as Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a nation of citizens with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance and;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians ("LTBB") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected legislative body of the Tribe;
- WHEREAS** the LTBB Law Enforcement Department, LTBB Natural Resources Department, LTBB Tribal Court and LTBB Prosecuting Attorney's Office provide justice services to the Tribal community, with collaboration from several other LTBB Departments and Programs, including, but not limited to: Human Services (Victim Services), Youth Services and Health Department (Behavioral Health Services);
- WHEREAS** LTBB desires to develop a comprehensive project to address LTBB public safety, criminal and juvenile justice, and victimization issues;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Law Enforcement Department has received its authority with the Bureau of Indian Affairs Special Law Enforcement Commissions to Tribal Police that allow the enforcement of applicable federal criminal status as defined in Title 18 of the United States Code, Section 1151 as federal criminal laws applicable to Indian Country, namely the General Crimes Act, and the Major Crimes Act along with Non-Indian Misdemeanor Violations Docket;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Natural Resources Department Conservation Officers are career law enforcement officers that have been given authority to enforce and uphold the regulations under Waganakising Odawak Tribal Code Title IV, Natural Resource Protection;
- WHEREAS** the Tribe currently operates a Survivor Outreach Services Program through its Department of Human Services to provide assistance to victims of domestic violence-related crimes;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians operates a Youth Services program with a mission that all youth will be educated spiritually, mentally, physically and emotionally to create a strong a safe community.

WHEREAS the United States Department of Justice is soliciting applications for the Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation, Fiscal Year 2016 Competitive Grant that includes funding opportunities from several Justice Offices, including the Office of Community Oriented Policing, Bureau of Justice Assistance, Office for Victims of Crime, Office on Violence Against Women, and the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention;

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is eligible for funding from the US Department of Justice, Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians authorizes and supports this request for funding from the United States Department of Justice, Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation (CTAS) FY 2016 Grant to implement a three-year comprehensive justice grant project.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians will retain any federally-funded hired law enforcement officers for at least 12 months after the grant period ends.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the LTBB Tribal Chair, Vice Chair, Tribal Administrator, or another designee from the Tribal Chair is authorized to execute any documents necessary to apply for, receive, and administer funds under the grant.
