Request for funds as a sub-grantee from the
Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan
Funding from U.S. Department of Health and Human Services,
Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration,
Tribal Opioid Treatment and Recovery Initiative (TOTR)

WHEREAS the Waganakising Odawak, known in English as Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a nation of citizens with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians ("LTBB") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected Legislative body of the Tribe;

WHEREAS: the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a member of the Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, Inc., a non-profit corporation duly organized under a State Charter filed April 16, 1968; and

WHEREAS: Article II of the Articles of Incorporation of the Inter-tribal Council of Michigan, Inc. established a joint organization representing the twelve (12) federally recognized tribes in the State of Michigan and is composed of a Board of Directors, including those whom are elected officials from the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians; and

WHEREAS: The Board of Directors is the governing body of the Inter-tribal Council of Michigan and meets every three months to review all contracts held by the Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, Inc.; and

WHEREAS: The Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, Inc., desires to apply for the Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) , Tribal Opioid Treatment and Recovery Initiative, in order to carry out a voucher program for treatment for underinsured American Indian/Alaskan Natives (AI/AN) with an Opioid Use Disorder. The Anishnaabek Healing Circle ATR Program will ensure client choice within a comprehensive array of treatment and recovery support service options while strengthening the individual's capacity to build and sustain a life in recovery; and

WHEREAS: The Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan supports building the capacity of the federally recognized tribes in Michigan to develop their local systems of care to address healing and recovery from opioid use disorder; and

WHEREAS: The previously funded ATR II and ATR III programs have made a very positive impact on outcomes for Native Americans and their family members who have received clinical treatment and recovery support services since October, 2007; and we wish to see those positive impacts continue to expand and grow;

WHEREAS: The Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians supports building the capacity of federally recognized tribes in Michigan to develop a comprehensive recovery oriented system of care that includes tribal providers and non-tribal collaborators;




