Designate Land Use of Aldrich Cabins and Assignment to Natural Resource Department.
27 E. Wilderness Drive, Carp Lake, Michigan

WHEREAS the Waganakising Odawak Nation, known as the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, and its citizens are vested with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);

WHEREAS in 2000, Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians purchased property for \$242,830.00 located at 27 E. Wilderness Drive, Carp Lake, Michigan

WHEREAS in accordance with the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Constitution, Tribal Council approves land uses, zoning and leases;

WHEREAS the Natural Resources Department and Natural Resources Commission recommend the use of Aldridge property to be designated for camping.

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Camping Regulations state Tribal Council must designate camping as an approved land use;

WHEREAS the legal description of the property is:
Commencing at a concrete monument at the West ¼ corner of Section 27, Township 39 North, Range 5 West; thence North 02°03'37" East along the West line of said Section 27, 1320.02 feet to a concrete monument at the Southeast corner of Government Lot 1, Section 28, Township 39 North, Range 5 West; thence North 02°09'09" East along the West line of said Section 27, 874.98 feet to a concrete monument at the Southwest corner of Lot 1 of the plat of "Big Stone Bay" as recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds for Emmet County,

Michigan, being the Point of Beginning of this description; thence North 02°03'47" East (recorded as North 01°12'00" West) along the West line of said Section 27 and along the west line of said Lot 1, 264.50 feet to a T-iron stake, thence North 36°16'14" East 146.31 feet to a T-iron stake on the shore of Lake Michigan; thence South 53°16'32" East (recorded as South 56°24'00" East) along said shore 111.52 feet to a ¾ inch iron pipe on the East line of said Lot 1; thence South 03°25'21" West (recorded as South) along the East line of said Lot 1, 319.89 feet (recorded as 320.22 feet) to a ¾ inch iron pipe at the Southeast corner of said Lot 1; thence North 88°43'13" West (recorded as South 88°01'00" West) along the South line of said Lot 1, 166.41 feet (recorded as 166.68 feet) to the Point of Beginning; being a part of Government Lot 3, Section 27, Township 39 North, Range 5 West and also a part of Lot 1 of the plat of "Big Stone Bay," Emmet County Records.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council does hereby designate land use to the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Natural Resources Department for the use of camping. The property and buildings located at 27 E. Wilderness Drive, Carp Lake, Michigan and to the Natural Resources Department, Environmental Services to store and maintain a trailer with equipment for possible oil spills in the Straits of Mackinaw.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this land designation shall remain in effect until such time that it is either revoked or revised by a majority vote of Tribal Council.


CERTIFICATION
