Designate Land Use of Cross Village Parcel and Assignment to Natural Resource Department

WHEREAS the Waganakising Odawak Nation, known as the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, and its citizens are vested with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);


WHEREAS in 2005, Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians purchased property for water front and boat access in Cross Village, Michigan;

WHEREAS in accordance with the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Constitution, Tribal Council approves land uses, zoning and leases;

WHEREAS the Natural Resources Department and Natural Resources Commission recommend the use of the Cross Village, Michigan parcel for camping;

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Camping Regulations state Tribal Council must designate camping as an approved land use;

WHEREAS the legal description of the property is:
Part of Lots 32,33,34,35,36 and 37, J.C. Glenn's Plat of Sections 26,32,33 and 34, Township 38 North, Range 6 West, Cross Village Township, Emmet County, Michigan, described as:
Commencing at the Southwest corner of Section 34, Township 38 North, Range 6 West, Emmet County, Michigan; thence along the West line of said Section 34; North 0°44'01" East 1990.78 feet; thence along the Southeasterly line of Block 13, Plat of the Village of the Cross and the Northwesterly line of Highway M-119, South 53°05'31" West 23.66 feet; thence along the Southwesterly line of said



Block 13 North 36°42'28" West 191.40 feet; thence along the Northwesterly line of said Village of the Cross Plat South 53°05'31" West 363.66 feet to the Place of Beginning; thence along the Northeasterly line of unrecorded Block 24 and its Southerly extension North 36°52'10" West 189.01 feet; thence along the Northwesterly line of said Block 24; South 53°29'35" West 132.86 feet; thence along the boundary lines and the Southerly extension thereof of Amended J.C. Glenn's Plat as recorded in Liber 11 of Plats, Pages 35 and 36 in the following courses: North 37°08'27" West 566.74 feet, and North 52°51'52" East 690.42 feet; thence along an agreement line North 36°40'50" West 45.15 feet to the ordinary high water contour of Lake Michigan also being Point A; thence along the ordinary high water contour of Lake Michigan in the following three courses; North 69°09'20" East 62.09 feet; North 65°07'18" East 88.46 feet; and North 79°42'34" East 32.09 feet to Point B; thence South 15°22'28" East 91.05 feet; thence South 36°40'50" East 134.04 feet; thence South 46°49'32" West 264.35 feet; thence South 13°27'53" East 382.60 feet; thence along the Southerly right of way of Chippewa Drive in the following two courses; South 33°53'28" West 182.01 feet and 125.78 feet along the arc of a circular curve to the left, radius 101.86, delta 70°44'54", chord South 1°28'59" East 117.94 feet; thence South 53°05'31" West 41.25 feet to the Place of Beginning, subject to the rights of the public in Chippewa Drive, Waterfront Drive and a Trail Road if any (Trail Road is also known as Park Lane), with all riparian rights attached thereto between the sidelines extended from both points A and B Northwesterly at a bearing of N 36°40'50"W to the water's edge of Lake Michigan.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council does hereby designate land use to the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Natural Resources Department for the use of camping. The property located at Cross Village, Michigan.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this land designation shall remain in effect until such time that it is either revoked or revised by a majority vote of Tribal Council.
