Request for Funding from the United States Department of the Interior
Bureau of Indian Affairs
FY 2020 Rights Protection Implementation

- WHEREAS** the Waganakising Odawak, known in English as Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a nation of citizens with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians ("LTBB") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected Legislative body of the Tribe;
- WHEREAS** the Tribe has established a Natural Resources Department (NRD) and a Natural Resources Commission whose purpose is to provide oversight and regulation of utilization of natural resources within the LTBB's jurisdiction and to provide community input in development and fulfillment of project objectives at regularly scheduled meetings of the Natural Resource Commission;
- WHEREAS** the Natural Resources Department mission statement is to *"wisely utilize our natural resources in order to promote, honor and respect our traditional, spiritual and physical relationship with the land and waters. We will implement management strategies that protect our resources on, above, below and within the land and waters for the future benefit of our Tribe;"*
- WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Natural Resources Department has developed a five-year Strategic Plan that provides direction and guidance for the Department that includes a goal to identify, assess, and monitor fish and wildlife communities within the inland lakes, streams and wetlands within the LTBB Reservation;
- WHEREAS** the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs is providing FY 2020 funding for Rights Protection Implementation (RPI)

activities to implement the 2000 Great Lakes Consent Decree and the 2007 Inland Consent Decree as a part of its Trust Responsibility to LTBB;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians authorizes application for and acceptance of FY 2020 Rights Protection Implementation funding from the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs with intent to receive funds under P.L. 93-638 contracting.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the LTBB Tribal Chair, Vice Chair, Executive Directors, or another designee from the Tribal Chair is authorized to execute any documents necessary to apply for, receive, and administer funds under the grant.
