FY 2020 Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)
Tannery Creek Crossing Improvement Project

WHEREAS the Waganakising Odawak, known in English as Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a nation of citizens with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians (“LTBB”) is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected Legislative body of the Tribe;

WHEREAS the Tribe has established a Natural Resources Department and a Natural Resources Commission whose purpose is to provide oversight and regulation of utilization of natural resources within the LTBB’s jurisdiction and to provide community input in development and fulfillment of project objectives at regularly scheduled meetings of the Natural Resource Commission;

WHEREAS the Natural Resource Department mission statement is to *“wisely utilize our natural resources in order to promote, honor and respect our traditional, spiritual and physical relationship with the land and waters. We will implement management strategies that protect our resources on, above, below and within the land and waters for the future benefit of our Tribe;”*

WHEREAS the Natural Resource Department’s Environmental Services Program provides water quality services that assess habitat conditions and conduct biological surveys and research specific to each body of water to aid in lake management and watershed plans to determine best uses and management strategies for LTBB surface waters.

WHEREAS the Natural Resources Conservation Service has announced FY 2020 Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) funds available to address water quality and aquatic organism passage and habitat in an effort to protect a multi-tribal fishery.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians authorizes and supports this grant application to the Natural Resources Conservation Service for a Tannery Creek stream crossing improvement project to create better water quality and aquatic organism passage and habitat within the Tannery Creek watershed.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the LTBB Tribal Chair, Vice Chair, Executive Directors, or another designee from the Tribal Chair is authorized to execute any documents necessary to apply for, receive, and administer funds under the grant.
