Request for Funding from the U.S. Administration for Children and Families
Family First Transition Act
Family First Prevention Services Transition Grants FY 2020

WHEREAS the Waganakising Odawak Nation, known as the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, and its citizens are vested with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians ("LTBB" or "Tribe") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);

WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected legislative body of the Tribe;

WHEREAS the Tribe operates a Department of Human Services with the primary mission to support and preserve all aspects of family life, and to wrap LTBB Human Services around the Tribal community, including the children;

WHEREAS the LTBB Department of Human Services receives Title IV-B Stephanie Tubbs Jones Child Welfare Services Program (Title IV-B, Subpart 1) and the MaryLee Allen Promoting Safe and Stable Families Program (Title IV-B, Subpart 2) funds to provide child welfare services that can be used for prevention of and response to child abuse and neglect.

WHEREAS the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, Administration on Children, Youth and Families has announced the availability of one-time Family First Prevention Services Transition Grants to be used for any purpose specified in title IV-B Subpart I and Subpart II.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians authorizes and supports this request for funding from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families Family First Prevention Services Transition Grants FY 2020 to assist in providing child welfare

services that can be used for prevention of and response to child abuse and neglect in the Tribe.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the LTBB Tribal Chair, Vice Chair, Executive Directors, or another designee from the Tribal Chair is authorized to execute any documents necessary to apply for, receive, and administer funds under the grant.
