**RESOLUTION # 052304-10**

ITC Application for *Access To Recovery Grant*  
From the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services,  
Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration,  
Center for Substance Abuse Treatment

**WHEREAS:** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians (“LTBB” or “Tribe”) is a Federally recognized Indian Tribe reaffirmed by the United States Congress on September 21, 1994 in Public Law 103-324, as amended, which exercises sovereign governmental authority over the people, land, and water within its jurisdiction and administers a wide range of governmental programs;

**WHEREAS:** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a member of the Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, Inc., a non-profit corporation duly organized under a State Charter filed April 16, 1968;

**WHEREAS:** Article II of the Articles of Incorporation established a joint tribal organization which now represents eleven (11) federally recognized tribes in Michigan; these being: Bay Mills Indian Community, Hannahville Indian Community, Keweenaw Bay Indian Community, Lac Vieux Desert Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians, Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe, Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians, Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians, Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians, Pokagon Band of Pottawatomis Indians, Match-e-be-nash-she-wish Band of Pottawatomis Indians, and Nottawaseppi Huron Pottawatomis;

**WHEREAS:** the Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, Inc., desires to apply for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Access To Recovery (ATR) Grant #TI 04-009, in order to provide client choice among substance abuse clinical treatment and recovery support service providers, expand access to a comprehensive array of clinical treatment and recovery support (including faith-based/culturally-based programmatic options) and increase substance abuse treatment capacity through a voucher system of payment;

**WHEREAS:** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians supports building the capacity of the federally recognized tribes in Michigan to develop a whole system of care among themselves and reaching out into the community-at-large.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians join the Inter-Tribal Council of Michigan, Inc., as a partner in the Anishnabe Access To Recovery (ATR) Network. As a partner the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians will function as a Primary Tribal Site Provider in the Network to provide substance abuse treatment and recovery support services; participate in the Advisory Council to this project, provide representation to the ATR provider Panel. The Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians agrees to all data collection, reporting, and grant requirements, as defined by the Center for Substance Abuse Treatment.

**CERTIFICATION**

As Tribal Chairman and Tribal Secretary, we certify that this Resolution was duly adopted by the Tribal Council of the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians at a regular meeting of the Tribal Council held May 23, 2004 at which a quorum was present, by a vote of 6 in favor, 1 opposed, 0 abstentions, and 0 absent as recorded by this roll call:
